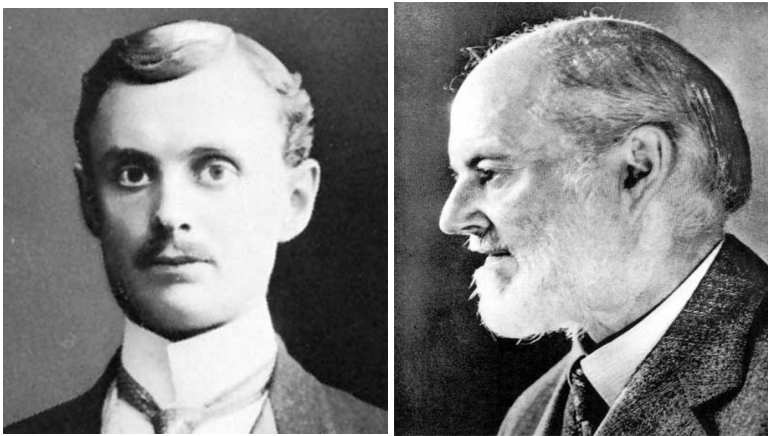

70. What is the three-letter abbreviation used to describe the system of postal codes used in the U.S.?

71. What is the name of this unique fresh water lake and river system, situated in Cambodia? The lake is known for its biodiversity as well as due to the fact that the river flow into the lake changes direction twice a year. When the Mekong river floods, the water flows into the lake, and in drier seasons, the water flows out of the lake and into the Mekong river.

79. *Hawking radiation* is a term used to describe the radiation of particles and anti-particles emitted from a black hole, causing the black hole to evaporate. However, this radiation is also attributed and named after a different scientist, who suggested that black holes should have a well-defined entropy two years prior to Hawking. What is the name of this Mexican-Israeli theoretical scientist?
